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Description of the Internship

Problem Statement: Please describe the main issue(s) addressed during the internship:

Breast Cancer has been one of the most prevalent diseases among the female population in Egypt. Incidence rates has reached more than 40% in the last decade, scoring the highest cancer incidence among females in Egypt. This disease has resulted in significant decrease in the quality of life, not only among females, but also among their families, due to the terrible consequences of the late stages of the disease and even the side effects of different kinds of therapies. This Non-communicable disease and its rising prevalence over years has led to increased directed efforts of several governmental and non-governmental organizations, in order to fight this disease and allow undiseased women to prevent it and diseased ones to fight in and live better and healthier lives.

What is the main goal(s) of the Internship?

The main goal is to capacitate the incoming medical students by providing them with more knowledge and skills concerning breast cancer in Egypt from clinical and public health aspects starting, in addition to allowing them to understand the magnitude of the breast cancer problem in Egypt and the way by which our hosting organization is trying to tackle the breast cancer problem by different means as an example of what cancer/ breast cancer organizations do in Egypt, in order to prevent and treat the disease as a means on decreasing its incidence and prevalence successfully.

What are the objectives of the Internship?

- The incoming would learn more about the epidemiology and statistics of the breast cancer in the hospital
- The incoming would understand the process of early detection and prevention of breast cancer and how women are getting aware of the process with the aid of specialists in the hospital
- The incoming would observe and understand the work of the clinical pharmacy and the infection control system in the hospital
- The incoming would understand the methods of evaluating the work in the hospital and how the quality assurance works
- The incoming would observe the breast cancer treatment including but not limited to therapies sessions, surgeries, examination and diagnosis

What is the expected outcome(s) of the Internship?

The incoming will understand the functioning of the breast cancer hospital and will understand how the breast cancer problem is tackled in Egypt. The incoming will also acquire knowledge and skills on the prevention and treatment of breast cancer from both clinical and public health related aspects.

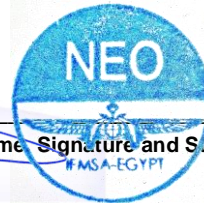
